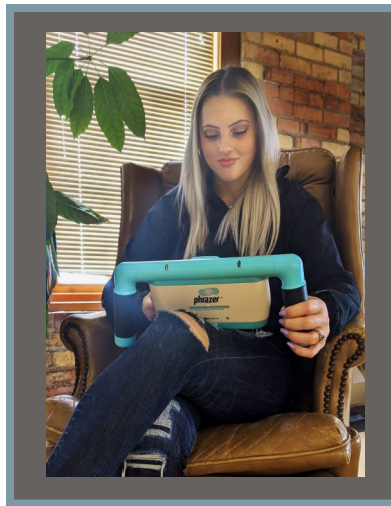

What is Althing?

Althing offers novel K-12 and community health solutions with unique applications for education enhancement, health and community services that feature total equity across demographics. A model that has proven to be effective, efficient and highly scalable, the Althing health module includes a Screening for Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT+) interface that is an established method of identifying and addressing the rising mental health and addiction challenges communities face today.



Help for Students

Empowers districts to provide qualified health screeners to the student population in an efficient and effective manner.

The screeners identify and mitigate depression, addiction, safety concerns, food insecurity, and other potential health issues while providing immediate interventions and referrals to qualified health professionals through the Phrazer/Kitsune® platform.

Components of the Student SBIRT+ Health Service Experience

Stakeholder Engagement

The school district informs and involves key stakeholders about the Althing SBIRT+ services. Key stakeholders include teachers, support professionals (counselors, psychologists, social workers, etc), school nursing staff, and more.

Parent Notification

Parents are notified of the planned student SBIRT+ program as part of a universal, routine health service as well as an opt-out pathway. The school district ensures parent notifications are sent out in advance of the event and provides SSC with the list of opted-out students.

Screening

After an introduction to the program and process, students are provided a PKS unit to start the SBIRT+. While the students complete the survey, support professionals track students' progress and needs through the cockpit.

Brief Intervention

For students showing minimal to medium risk, the PKS provides brief interventions to the student to increase awareness and enhance motivation toward behavior change and change readiness. For students with high risk, support professionals are alerted through the cockpit with recommendations on how to proceed.

Referral To Treatment

For students with high acuity, the PKS offers a pathway to interventions /referrals for services as needed. This process is aligned with state guidelines and protocols for students whose screening results merit further attention, including how information will be communicated between PKS, school professionals, and external referral source.

District Steps

Step 1: Join The Althing

- Execute agreement with SSC (Pricing \$1,250)
- Execute agreement with Althing
- Agree to provide student insurance information or choose fee per student (\$50)

Step 2: Get Started

- Provide student information to SSC
- Define involvement of student support professionals
- Send out parent notification letter
- Engage stakeholders

Step 3: SBIRT+ Event

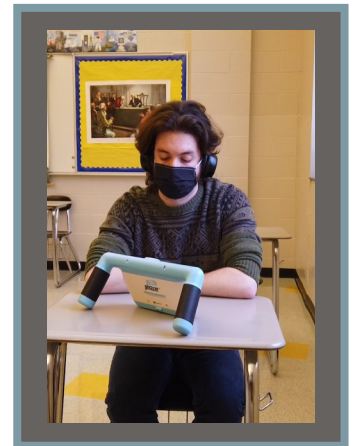
- Confirm proper data flow
- Confirm accuracy of additional requested questions
- Training of student support professionals
- Set schedule for screening
- Perform SBIRT+ services
- Have real time access to aggregate data
- Embed existing partnerships with local health services
- SSC provides onsite support for initial rollout

SSC/Althing Provide

- Isolated blocks for HIPAA and FERPA data
- Rollout recommendations based on district size/volume
- Engagement features and a cockpit for real time provider involvement
- Template letter for parent notification
- Information modules about SBIRT+ services for stakeholders

Althing Program Benefits

- Opportunity to reach all students with a validated, approved screener
- Alerts in the cockpit indicate risk level and support triage
- Majority of brief interventions occur through CITE engagements on PKS
- Support to professionals to connect with high-risk students through the cockpit in real-time
- Tools to engage parents/guardians for consent (any language)
- Options for further services on PKS
