


1. We currently have 5 oral rounds at Sub-Regional and Regional. Would you prefer 3 or 4 or 5 oral rounds at Sub-Regional?


2. We currently have 5 oral rounds at Sub-Regional and Regional. Would you prefer 3 or 4 or 5 oral rounds at Regional?



3. We used RCTC to hold Sub-Regionals, with all teams from a tier competing on the same day. Should we continue to hold Sub-Regionals at RCTC?







Some accept answers that others do not during the round robins. We specifically addressed that issue at rhe sub-regional competition which is one reason why it took us so long to do the read-through.





10. When would you prefer the 2010-2011 Knowledge Bowl Advisors Meeting is held? (Advisors will sign up for Round Robin dates)




