

Driving Directions to Heintz Center

1926 Collegeview Drive SE, Rochester

HWY 52 Southbound:

Exit at 41st STREET exit to access 37th STREET NW (turns into East Circle Drive and County Road 22) and travel east through the intersection of US 63. Before the County Road 9 intersection (stop light), merge right onto Country Road 9 (College View Road). Continue past the Fuad Mansour Soccer Complex. Turn left at the 4-way stop and turn left into the west parking lot of Heintz Center (enter in Door H15). Buses must park in the east lot (other side from drop off).

HWY 63 Southbound:

Exit (left) at 37th STREET NW (turns into East Circle Drive and County Road 22). Follow the directions outlined above.

HWY 63 Northbound:

Exit at HWY 14 East (also known as 12th Street SE) and travel east. Turn left at 15th Avenue SE/Marion Road intersection. Follow 15th Avenue to 4th Street SE and turn right onto 4th Street. Continue to the 4-way stop and turn right. Turn left to enter the west parking lot of Heintz Center and enter in Door H15. Buses must park in the east lot (other side from drop off).

I-90:

Exit at HWY 63 North and follow instructions above.

HWY 14 Westbound or Eastbound:

Exit at County Road 22 (30th Avenue) and follow to County Road 9 intersection. Turn left onto Country Road 9 (College View Road). Continue past the Fuad Mansour Soccer Complex. Turn left at the 4-way stop and turn left into the west parking lot of Heintz Center (enter in Door H15). Buses must park in the east lot (other side from drop off).

Meet Your Conference Presenters

Nick Ozment has written for over 100 different books and magazines. He has created memorable monsters in fiction, and taught college classes on fantasy literature. In the past decade he has led history and ghost tours in Rochester. Choose Your Conference Sessions

A Bring Your Imaginary Creatures to Life! (fantasy writing/storytelling)

If your favorite stories are populated with strange monsters and fantastical beasts, this is the class for you! Published fantasy author Nicholas Ozment will give you tips and tricks for creating magical creatures that your readers will believe. Bring your imaginary creatures to life through sketches and writing prompts. Nick Ozment

B Communicating Through Art and Design (illustrating)

Learn the art of visual communication. In this class we will explore what it means to communicate through art. Most good design, illustration, or art carries a message with it. A picture is worth a thousand words. We will view different types of book cover designs the message they convey. As an activity, we will do some sketching and work on a simple book cover design. C Comic Jam! (comic/cartoon)

Collaborate with your fellow students to draw hilarious comics together! You draw the first panel of your comic, then pass it to someone else, who will draw the next panel, and so on! How will these stories turn out by the end? Micah Amundsen

D Wood Slice String Art (creative)

Get ready for a hands on project complete with hammers, nails, wood and string! Each student will create their very own wood slice string art. Students choose their favorite colors to make each project customizable. Finished pieces can be used as ornaments, hanging decorations, gifts, etc. Angie Severson

E Soft Pastels Made Easy (drawing)

In this workshop, students will be introduced to the art of coloring photographs using soft pastels. Each student will be supplied with a photo and working with soft pastels, will use their own imagination to bring the photo to life. Each student will produce a completed work of art. Terri Michels

F It's Alive! Creating Incredible Characters (writing)

How do writers create characters that feel real? How can we make readers believe in a person or creature who does not exist? In this fiction workshop, we will get to know our characters, starting with the basics and then digging deeper. Pick your characters' pockets, look at their wish lists and peek into their journals, all while learning about motivation, backstory, and voice. Jacqueline West

G Snowball Write-Fight! (writing/storytelling)

Look out! There's gonna be a blizzard! One person's trash is another person's treasure they say, so let's write it, toss it (as in a snowball fight!), snatch someone else's snowball (story), then add to it before tossing it again and again! Warm up that writing and tossing arm and join the snowstorm! Mary Bleckwehl

H Titles That Tear It Up (songwriting)

Do you write songs in your head? Me too! Would you like to see if we can write a song together in class? Same! We will brainstorm creative titles on the spot, pick one and then we will come up with a new song you will help me write in class. See you there! Amanda Grace

I Bookmark Your Creative)

Together we will play around with liquid watercolors in this creative and fun workshop where there's no wrong way to express yourself. Have a favorite saying or theme? Let's add it to your bookmark! We will make enough bookmarks for you to gift to a friend or loved one because reading is fundamental and just like creativity it should be shared. Elin Johnson

J Charismatic Characters (drawing/storytelling)

From books to movies to video games, we all have characters that we fall in love with. We follow their adventures, wanting to see or read more. But where do these characters come from? It starts with imagination and an idea. Using prompts and choice art materials, students will explore creating their own characters, giving them personality and bringing them to life through storytelling. Joy Blewett

K Readers Theater (acting)

Readers Theater is a form or performance that requires actors to read with EXPRESSION! With no memorization required, youth can focus on the moods and characteristics of their character without the stress of memorizing lines. In this session, your teacher will audition and cast the entire class in a LIVE performance of a fairy tale style Readers Theater script. Readers Theater can be silly or serious, but this conference will keep things light so we remember that learning is fun. Fun props and silly costumes have been a hit at past conferences! Come to this class prepared to be someone or something you are not! Melanie Schmidt

L Sand Art Bottle (creative)

Explore the art of Sand Bottles with Craft lab, we will learn about Sand Art History and you will create your very own one of a kind bottle. Can't wait to see your designs! Megan Butts

M Tie-Dye Dandelions (painting)

Join Sunshine and Roses Traveling Art Studio to paint on canvas! Students will create super awesome Tie-Dye Dandelions on an 11x14 canvas. Step by step instructions will be provided. Students do not need any previous painting experience or special skills. First time painting on canvas, no problem! Grace Kittelson

Conference check-in opens at 8:15 am. The supervising adult should check in at the registration table to pick up a box of conference materials. After distributing conference materials, chaperones should store jackets, lunches, etc., in the box and leave it in a designated area in the Commons.
